2025 Annual Awards Entry Criteria:
Large Project

Entry Criteria for Large Project (with more than 150 plants)

The sustainability initiatives within your company have been crucial to driving continuous improvements, yielding long-term benefits for both the environment and the community.

Total Points: 100

Word Limit: Please ensure your submission does not exceed 1,000 words.

Image: Submit up to fifteen (15) named images (PNG or JPG format, max 2MB per image) showcasing your project.

Image Guidelines: Include images of the design, installation, and maintenance stages where applicable.

Criteria 1: Quality of Design

(Maximum Score 25 Points)

- a. **Project Brief and Vision:** What was the brief and vision provided by your client? How did it guide your design choices and outcome?
- b. **Impact on the Space:** How does the design enhance or improve the space? Discuss how the design contributes to the aesthetics, functionality, or overall atmosphere.
- c. **Longevity of Design:** How will the design stand the test of time, both aesthetically and horticulturally? Consider plant longevity, maintenance requirements, and design durability.

Criteria 2: Quality of Installation

(Maximum Score 25 Points)

- a. **Plant Selection:** What plant varieties were chosen for this project and why? Consider factors such as suitability for the environment, aesthetics, and sustainability.

- b. Containers (if applicable):** Were containers used in the design? If so, were they in pristine condition, and why were these specific containers chosen?
- c. Top Dressing:** What top dressing was used to enhance the display, and how does it contribute to the overall appearance and health of the plants?
- d. Access and Work Area Obstacles:** Were there any obstacles in the work area, and how were they addressed to ensure smooth installation?

Criteria 3: Innovation

(Maximum Score 25 Points)

- a. Unique Materials:** Were any unique or unusual materials used in the design? Explain why they were chosen and how they contribute to the project's innovation.
- b. New Plant Varieties:** Were new or unusual plant varieties incorporated into the design? If so, how do they contribute to the uniqueness of the project?
- c. Innovative Design Features:** What are the innovative aspects of the design? Consider any unconventional approaches to layout, plant selection, or materials.

Criteria 4: Maintenance

(Maximum Score: 25 Points)

- a. Maintenance Schedule:** What is the maintenance schedule for this project, and were any innovative maintenance practices implemented to ease upkeep?
- b. Disease and Pest Control:** Describe your approach to pest and disease management. How does your maintenance plan address these concerns sustainably?
- c. Environmental Conditions:** How were environmental conditions such as light, temperature, and humidity considered when selecting plants and designing the project?
- d. Use of Sub-Irrigation Technology:** Was sub-irrigation technology used in the design? If so, how does it contribute to the sustainability or functionality of the project?
- e. Pruning Practices:** What pruning techniques were used to ensure the long-term health and aesthetic quality of the plants?
